

Spanish Verbs 46-50

Fiarse

Meaning: To trust, to rely on

Memory Tip: Sounds like 'fear,' but it's the opposite—you trust someone, so you don't fear them.

Flipar

Meaning: To freak out, to be amazed

Memory Tip: Sounds like 'flip,' as in flipping out over something amazing or shocking.

Fregar

Meaning: To scrub, to annoy

Memory Tip: Sounds like 'friction,' which you use when scrubbing. It can also refer to something annoying, like friction between people.

Fumar

Meaning: To smoke

Memory Tip: Sounds like 'fume,' which is what smoke produces.

Hacer bola

Meaning: To join in, to group together

Memory Tip: 'Hacer' means 'to do,' and 'bola' means 'ball,' so think of joining in like forming a ball or group of people.
